Agriculture Timely Tips!



This summer we have experienced sporadic rain events, from constant rain to drought. These environmental factors can cause diseases, reduce oxygen and nutrient availability, and ultimately reduced yields. In order to have a successful garden no matter the weather, it is crucial to maintain even moisture throughout the summer. General rule of thumb: Gardens require 1 to 1.5 inches of water per week. Don't give up on fly control as the late summer may merit combined methods for adequate control of fly populations. Also be sure to check your water supply frequently as highproducing cows may require as much as 20 gallons in the summer heat. Friendly reminder for cattlemen to update their Beef Quality Assurance (**BQA**) certification, which is due at the time of application for the TDA funded Ag Enhancement (**TAEP**).
