TN Agricultural Enhancement Program

TAEP provides cost share dollars to agricultural producers. To be eligible, applicants must meet basic requirements that vary between sectors. For example, livestock producers must gain Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) certification prior to the October 1-7 application period and meet minimum livestock/acreage requirements: tn.gov/taep
