



- Work on your garden layout based on rotation and previous pest/disease issues

- Consider utilizing dormant oil to control scales and mites that may damage ornamental plants



The 2022 TN Beef Resource Management Calendars are here! This calendar helps producers with formulating an overall management plan to optimize production. Come by our office to pick up your free calendar. With colder temperatures, be sure to consider the following on your cow-calf operation:

- Consider an alternative system of hay feeding like fence line feeders to decrease damage to pastures and hay waste
- Have your forage analyzed to determine crude protein and total digestible nutrients
- Prepare pasture through grazing management plan, soil testing, and fertilization needs
