According to 30-year NOAA weather data where only

a 10% chance of a frost (<32 F) after date. Here are a few spring tasks to perform in your garden:

- Follow soil test advice for preplant fertilization
- Be sure to purchase disease resistant varieties and healthy stocky, dark green seedlings
- Fungicides are a preventative action used along with sanitation and crop rotation
- Scout often for pests and diseases by checking leaf undersides and interior leaves

- Consider replacing late calving cows and shortening your calving season to increase your returns- You can learn more about the benefits of this management strategy here: Calving Season
- Prepare for start of hay harvest and water for grazing season
- Assess opportunity for weed control and warm-season grass
- Consult with your veterinarian on the vaccines and health products for your herd
